An act to incorporate the Bangor Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. George Stetson, N. C. Ayer, William H. Mc- Corporators. Crillis, Charles Stetson, D. M. Howard, G. L. Boynton, Isaac S. Whitman, R. S. Prescott, Joseph S. Wheelwright, S. H. Blake, Charles P. Stetson, G. W. Spratt, E. M. Hersey, F. A. Wilson, T. N. Egery, C. F. Woodard, A. Thompson, Charles Hayward and George Varney, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted and made a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Bangor Manufacturing Company, with all the powers and Corporate name, privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities pro- duties. vided by the laws of this state concerning manufacturing companies.

Sect. 2. Said corporation is authorized to manufacture Authorized to cotton, woolen, linen and flax, in the city of Bangor, in the goods, purchase and hold represent the country of Penobscot, state of Maine, to purchase and hold recty, creet buildings, etc. real and personal estate, not to exceed in value the sum of two millions of dollars, to build and erect such buildings and machinery as their convenience may require, and make all necessary rules and regulations for the prosecution of the same, consistent with the laws of this state.

The capital stock of said corporation shall not Capital stock. exceed two millions of dollars, the issue of which from time to time to be determined by the directors of the corporation or otherwise, as the stockholders may determine.

SECT. 4. George Stetson or any one of the other incor- First meeting, porators, is hereby authorized to call the first meeting of these corporators, by publishing notice thereof in the Bangor Daily Whig and Courier, or some other newspaper published in Bangor aforesaid, seven days at least before the meeting.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
