Chapter 29.CHAP. 29.

Resolve in favor of the Committee on Reform School.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state be directed to pay to Tobias Lord, Junior, the sum of forty-five dollars, the same being the amount paid by him for expenses of the committee on reform school, while on its recent visit to that institution, in accordance with the order of the legislature.

Approved March 9, 1881.

Chapter 30.

Resolve in favor of the Maine Industrial School for Girls.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is appropriated, the sum of four thousand dollars, for the use of the Maine Industrial School for Girls, at Hallowell, to meet the current expenses of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and four thousand dollars for the same purpose, for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

Industrial school for girls, in favor of.

Chapter 31.

Resolve in favor of Emery Brewer.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey two small islands, known as Sow and Pigs, situated in Casco Bay, near Pettengill's Island, to Emery Brewer of Freeport, in the county of Cumberland.

Chapter 32.

Resolve in favor of Peter McKenzie.

Resolved, That the land agent be and hereby is authorized to convey to Peter McKenzie of Maysville, all the right, title and interest the state of Maine has in and to lot numbered one,
