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NAME CHANGED .- CITY OF AUBURN.

Снар. 172 Whoever shall, in any way wilfully pollute the SECT. 6. Penalty for polluting water or injury to works.

water of said pond or stream, whether frozen or not, after said company shall have commenced taking the same, and whoever shall wilfully injure any of the works of said company, shall be punished by imprisonment not over two years, or by fine not exceeding one thousand dollars and shall be liable to an action for damages.

Capital stock.

The capital stock of said company shall be the SECT. 7. amount fixed by said company at its first meeting, not exceeding fifty thousand dollars.

SECT. 8. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 172.

An Act to change the name of Plantation number Eleven, Range One, in Aroostook County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That from and after the passing of this act, the Plantation heretofore called "Number Eleven, Range One," west from the east line of the state of Maine, in the county of Aroostook shall be called and known by the name of Cary Planta-But nothing in this act shall be construed to impair tion. any rights of said plantation.

Chapter 173.

An Act to amend "An Act to incorporate the oity of Auburn."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. The superintending school committee of the city of Auburn, shall consist of the mayor of said city, who shall be ex-officio chairman, and ten other persons to be elected as hereinafter provided.

Name changed to Cary plantation.

School committee to consist of mayor and ten other persons.
