Chapter 317.

An Act to repeal chapter two hundred and seven of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty, being an act to regulate the taking of fish in Dexter Pond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter two hundred and seven of the private and special Ch. 207, private laws of eighteen hundred and eighty, relating to the taking pealed. of fish in Dexter pond is hereby repealed.

Chapter 318.

An Act to amend the charter of the city of Bath.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The city council of the city of Bath shall have exclusive City council of authority to lay out, alter, widen, or discontinue any and all streets or public ways in said city, and as far as extreme low said city. water mark, without petition therefor, all proceedings under this act to be in conformity to the provisions of chapter twenty-six of the public laws of the year eighteen hundred and seventy-two.

Chapter 319.

An Act relating to Drains and Sewers in the City of Bath.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. It shall be the duty of the municipal officers of Municipal officers the city of Bath, before commencing the construction of any notice of intention to construct public drain or common sewer, to give notice of their inten- drains and tion to construct said drain or sewer, to appoint a time and place for a hearing in regard to the same, and give notice thereof by publishing the same for three successive weeks in some newspaper published in Bath.
