as may be deemed necessary and proper; to enter into and make any contract or agreement not inconsistent with the laws of this state.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

CHAP. 378

Chapter 378.

An Act to confirm and make valid the organization and doings of the proprietors of the Westbrook Social Library.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The organization of the proprietors of the Westbrook Social Library, a corporation located in Saccarappa, in the town of Westbrook, and their doings at their annual meeting on the sixteenth day of January, eighteen hundred and eighty-four, are hereby confirmed and declared legal and valid.

Doings of Westbrook Social Library, made valid.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may take and hold by purchase, gift, devise, or bequest, personal or real estate, in all not exceeding in value one hundred thousand dollars, owned at any one time, and may use and dispose thereof only for the purposes for which the corporation was organized.

May hold real estate.

SECT. 3. The town of Westbrook, whenever a town-hall shall be erected therein, may provide a room or rooms, for the accommodation of said corporation on such terms as may be agreed upon between the selectmen of said town and the directors of said corporation.

Town of Westbrook may provide rooms.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
