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#### Chapter 19.

An Act to make the first Monday in September of each year a Legal Holiday.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The first Monday in September of each year, SECT. 1. being the day celebrated and known as labor's holiday, is hereby made a legal public holiday, to all intents and purposes, in the same manner as thanksgiving, fast and Christmas days, the twenty-second day of February, the thirtieth day of May and the fourth day of July, are now by law made public holidays.

First Monday in September made a legal holiday.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved February 10, 1891.

#### Chapter 20.

An Act to fix the salary of the Judge of Probate for Knox County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. From and after the first day of January, in the salary of judge year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, the salary of the judge of probate for Knox county shall be three hundred and twenty-five dollars a year.

#### Chapter 21.

An Act amendatory of section thirty of Chapter ninety-one of the Revised Statutes, relating to Liens on Buildings and Lots.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section thirty of chapter ninety-one of the Revised Statutes, Sec. 30, ch. 91, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "altering," in the second line, the word 'moving,' and after the word "erected," in the ninth line, the words for to which it is moved,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:
