#### SALARIES OF PUBLIC OFFICERS-BOARD OF REGISTRATION.

#### Chapter 33.

An Act to amend chapter one hundred fifteen of the Revised Statutes entitled "Salaries of Public Officers and Compensation of Members of the Government."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one of said chapter is hereby amended in that para-R. S., amended. graph which provides for the salary of the secretary of the board of agriculture, by striking out the word "six" and inserting in lieu thereof the word 'fifteen,' so that said paragraph shall read as follows:

'The secretary of the board of agriculture, fifteen hundred Salary of secdollars, and reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred of agriculture, in the discharge of his duties, an account whereof shall be first audited by the governor and council, who from time to time may draw their warrants on the treasurer of state for such sums as are necessary to defray the same and other expenses provided for in chapter fifty-eight.'

Chapter 34.

Au Act to provide a Board of Registration in the Cities of this State.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. A board of registration is hereby established in Board of regiseach city of the state, which shall have the exclusive power lished. and authority to determine the qualification of voters therein, \_\_\_\_\_ and exclusive power to make up, correct and revise the list of voters in each of said cities, and shall perform all the duties and have, exclusively, all the powers now exercised by the municipal officers of said cities in making, preparing, revising and correcting the list of voters therein under chapter four of the revised statutes or any other statute relating thereto.

SECT. 2. Said board shall consist of three members who shall be residents and legal voters of the city where such board is established, one of whom shall be appointed and commissioned by the governor by and with the consent of his council for a term of four years, but the first term shall

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
