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to the persons entitled thereto the money or other property in his hands, as required by a decree of a probate court, he may perpetuate the evidence thereof by presenting to said court, without further notice, within one year after the decree is made, an account of such payments or of the delivery over of such property; which account being proved to the satisfaction of the court, and verified by the oath of the party, shall be allowed as his final discharge, and ordered to be recorded.'

Chapter 50.

An Act to amend section ninety-nine of chapter forty-seven of the Revised Statutes, relating to Savings Banks Deposits.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sec. 99, ch. 47,
R. S., amended.

Section ninety-nine of chapter forty-seven of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the word "deposit" in the fifth line thereof the words, 'all dividends included,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

May receive
deposits not
exceeding \$2,000
from one
depositor.

'SECT. 99. Such corporation may receive on deposit for the use and benefit of depositors, sums of money offered for that purpose; but shall not receive from any one depositor, directly or indirectly, over two thousand dollars; and no interest shall be paid to any one depositor for any amount of deposit, all dividends included, exceeding said sum, except for deposits by widows, orphans, administrators, executors, guardians, charitable institutions and as trust funds. The trustees may refuse any deposit at their pleasure.'

Chapter 51.

An Act regulating the salary of the Register of Probate for the County of Androscoggin.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Salary of regis-
ter of probate
for Androscog-
gin county,
fixed.

SECT. 1. On and after the first day of January in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and ninety-one, the salary of

the register of probate for the county of Androscoggin, shall CHAP. 52
be six hundred and fifty dollars per year.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 52.

An Act to exempt Little River, in Perry, from the provisions of chapter forty, Revised Statutes, so far as it applies to Fishways.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Little river, in Perry, Maine, shall be exempt from all the provisions of chapter forty, revised statutes, that relate to maintaining fishways in said river, except April, May and June.

Chapter 53.

An Act to amend paragraph ten, section six of chapter seventy-seven, Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and eight, Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, relating to the equity powers of the Supreme Judicial Court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Paragraph ten, section six of chapter seventy-seven, revised statutes as amended by chapter two hundred and eight, public laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, is hereby amended by striking out after the word "law" in the seventh line of said paragraph the words "and not exempt from such attachment and seizure," and by adding after the last word in said paragraph the following words: 'But no provision of this paragraph shall be so construed as to reach and apply in payment of a debt, any property exempted by sections thirty-eight and thirty-nine of chapter five, sections six, seven and eight of chapter fifteen, section eleven of chapter fifty-five, and by chapter eighty-one, revised statutes,' so that said paragraph, as amended, shall read as follows :
