three times the actual damage, to be recovered in any proper action.

May issue bonds and mortgage property. SECT. 10. Said corporation may issue its bonds for the construction of its works, upon such rates and times as it may deem expedient, not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, and may secure the same by mortgage of the franchise and property of said corporation.

First meeting, how called.

Sect. 11. The first meeting of said corporation may be called by written notice thereof, signed by any three of the corporators, by mailing the same to each corporator at his usual place of abode, postage prepaid, at least ten days before the time of said meeting.

Sect. 12. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 155.

An Act to authorize the Lewiston and Auburn Horse Railroad Company to use electricity as a motive power. $\dot{}$

Re it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Company, authorized to use electricity as a motive power. SECT. 1. The Lewiston and Auburn Horse Railroad Company is hereby authorized and empowered to use electricity as a motive power for propelling its street cars over and upon its lines of track as now constructed and hereafter to be constructed, within the cities of Lewiston and Auburn, first obtaining the consent of the municipal officers of said cities, and subject to such terms and conditions as the cities of Lewiston and Auburn may impose.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
