CHAP. 162

each fish taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice in said county of York, one-half to the use of the complainant and the other half to the use of said county.

Approved March 5, 1891.

### Chapter 162.

An Act to regulate the taking of trout from Ward's Brook and Ward's Pond, and Walker's Pond, so called, on said brook, in the town of Fryeburg.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Taking of fish in certain waters in Fryeburg, prohibited, except between May 1 and Aug. 1.

SECT. 1. All persons are forbidden from fishing for, or taking trout, or any kind of fish from Ward's brook, Ward's pond, and from Walker's pond, so called, on said brook, in Fryeburg, Oxford county, at any season of the year, except between the first day of May and the first day of August of each year.

SECT. 2. Any persons violating the provisions of this act, shall be liable to a fine of not more than ten dollars for each offense, and a further fine of one dollar for each fish so taken, to be recovered before any trial justice in Oxford county, one-half to the complainant, and one-half to the county of Oxford.

Approved March 5, 1891.

### Chapter 163.

An Act to protect land-locked salmon and trout in Marshall's pond, in the town of Anson, and its tributaries.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Taking of fish from Marshall's pond, prohibited for five years.

Sect. 1. No person shall take, catch, kill, fish for, or destroy any land-locked salmon or trout, in Marshall's pond, so called, in the town of Anson, in Somerset county, and the tributaries thereto, for a term of five years from the passage of this act.

Penalty for violation.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act, shall forfeit and pay the sum of five dollars for the offense, and one dollar for each and every trout or land-locked salmon so taken, caught, killed or destroyed, to be recovered

on complaint before any trial justice in Somerset county, one-half to the complainant and one-half to the town of Anson.

Approved March 5, 1891.

### Chapter 164.

An Act to prohibit the taking of trout and land-locked salmon from Anasagunticook Lake in the towns of Canton and Hartford.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

All persons are hereby prohibited from taking any land-locked salmon or trout from Anasagunticook lake in the towns of Canton and Hartford for the term of six years, under a penalty of five dollars for each salmon or trout taken from said lake, to be recovered by complaint, one-half to the use of the prosecutor, and one-half to the use of the county of Oxford.

Taking of fish from Anasagunticook lake, prohibited for six years.

—penalty for violation.

### Chapter 165.

An Act relating to the Farmington Village Corporation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The Farmington Village Corporation is hereby authorized to raise money by taxation or by loan, issuing its notes or script therefor, in order to compromise claims made against it by the holders of its alleged bonds and coupons issued in eighteen hundred and seventy-one, or any litigation in reference thereto, or for the purpose of carrying out any such compromise, or for either purpose it may issue its notes or bonds directly to the holders of such alleged bonds or coupons.

Corporation, authorized to raise money.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
