CHAP. 173 lease its roads, franchises and property for hire, or to contract for the running and managing the same with any individual or other railroad corporation for a term of years and such lease or contract so made with such individual or corporation shall be deemed valid and binding upon the parties entering into the same and either or both of said corporations may consolidate with any connecting railroad or railroads. And all such corporations are hereby authorized to make such sales, leases or consolidations; provided, however, that by reason of such contracts, sales, leases or consolidations the corporations owning the several roads shall not be released from any of their corporate liabilities.

May issue bonds and mortgage property.

Any corporation formed under the provisions SECT. 10. of this act is hereby authorized to issue its bonds from time to time to such amount as may be required by the corporation, in such form as the directors may deem advisable, and to secure the same by mortgage of its road, franchise and property, or in any other manner.

SECT. 11. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 173.

An Act to legalize the proceedings by which Lincoln Plantation was organized.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Proceedings of Lincoln planta-tion, made valid.

The proceedings by which Lincoln plantation in Oxford county was organized on the fifteenth day of September, eighteen hundred and seventy-five, are hereby confirmed, and the organization of said plantation is hereby declared legal and valid.
