Chapter 218.

An Act to renew and extend the charter of Cumberland Illuminating Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The charter of the Cumberland Illuminating Company, approved February twenty-four, eighteen hundred and eightyseven, is hereby renewed and extended for a period of four years from February ten, eighteen hundred and ninety-one.

Chapter 219.

An Act relating to the Female Orphan Asylum of Portland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The powers conferred upon the Female Orphan Asylum of Portland by its charter, approved February eighteenth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, and by an act of the legislature entitled "An Act to provide further for the Female Orphan Asylum of Portland," approved January twenty-third, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, are hereby so far enlarged as to authorize and enable its board of Managers, may provide for managers, in their discretion, to provide for the support, support of boys. instruction and employment of boys as well as girls; and if the discretion hereby conferred upon said board of managers shall at any time be exercised in favor of the reception of boys at said asylum, then all its corporate powers and duties, and all provisions of law relating thereto, are hereby extended so as to relate, so far as applicable, to male children as well as female children.

This act shall take effect when approved.
