#### Chapter 221.

An Act amendatory of section eight of chapter five hundred and eighteen of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, relating to Olinton Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section eight of chapter five hundred and eighteen of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine is hereby amended, by adding thereto the following words: but if said charter is not accepted at said first meeting, so called as aforesaid, then said Spearin and Gerald, or either of them, may call a second and third meeting, agreeably to the provisions of this act, for the purpose of further voting upon the acceptance of this charter as herein provided,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

Sec. 8, ch. 518, Private Laws of

1889, amended.

'Sect. 8. At the first meeting of said corporation, called agreeably to seventh section of this act, the legal voters shall vote by ballot on the question of accepting this charter, and if the majority of the voters present at said meeting shall vote in favor of its acceptance, then this act shall take effect, and the corporation shall then proceed to organize and choose its officers; but if said charter is not accepted at said first meeting, so called as aforesaid, then said Spearin and Gerald, or either of them, may call a second and third meeting, agreeably to the provisions of this act, for the purpose of further voting upon the acceptance of this charter, as herein provided.'

#### Chapter 222.

An Act authorizing the building of a bridge across tide waters in the town of Kennebunkport.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

James A. Strout and his associates, owners of Vaughn's island, in the town of Kennebunkport, are hereby authorized to build a bridge across Turbott's creek, in said town, to connect said island with the main land.
