Chapter 281.

An Act to prohibit taking land-locked salmon from, and to protect white perch in Snow, Ellis, McGraw, East, Long and Great Ponds, in Kennebec and Somerset counties.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Taking of land-locked salmon from certain ponds, prohibited for four years.

SECT. 1. No land-locked salmon shall be taken by any person in any way whatever from Snow pond, East pond, McGraw pond, Ellis pond, Long pond or Great pond, said ponds situated in the counties of Kennebec and Somerset, or from any stream flowing into or out of either of said ponds, for a period of four years from the first day of May, eighteen hundred ninety-one.

Taking of white perch for sale, prohibited.

SECT. 2. No person shall take any white perch from either of the ponds or streams named in section one, for the purpose of sale; and any person taking white perch from either of said ponds or streams in any manner whatever, for the purposes of sale, or who offers white perch so taken for sale, or who sells or in any manner disposes of white perch so taken for profit to himself or another, or ships said white perch so taken to any person outside of this state, shall be punished by a fine of ten dollars for each fish so taken, sold, offered for sale or shipped, as hereinbefore prohibited. The same to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice, police or municipal court, in either of said counties of Kennebec or Somerset, one-half to the complainant and one-half to the county in which said complaint is made.

Penalty, for violation of sec. 1.

SECT. 3. Any person who violates the provisions of section one of this act, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty dollars, one-half to the complainant and one-half to the county in which said complaint is made. The same to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice or police or municipal court in either of said counties of Kennebec or Somerset in which said complaint is made.
