Chapter 292.

An Act to incorporate the Trustees of the Erskine School in China, Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. John K. Erskine, W. J. Thompson, S. C. Starrett, Dana C. Hanson, of China, Maine, their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by name of the Trustees of the Erskine Academy in China, Maine, and by that name shall have the power to take and hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding thirty-five thousand dollars, for the purpose of establishing and maintaining an academy for the education of youth in common, higher English, scientific and classical studies, in China, and shall be authorized to receive, hold and manage all such gifts and grants as shall be made to them for that purpose.

Powers and by-laws.

SECT. 2. The said corporation shall have such powers for the accomplishment of the purposes aforesaid, as are or may be granted by law to similar corporations, and may establish by-laws and regulations for the suitable and convenient management of the business.

When act shall take effect.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and upon its approval by the governor, and any three of the trustees aforesaid may call a meeting of said corporation, by posting a notice on the said school building, fourteen days prior to the time of said meeting.

Chapter 293.

An Act to amend section one, chapter three hundred forty-three of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, relating to the taking of fish from Spectacle ponds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Sec. 1, ch. 343, Private Laws of 1889, amended.

SECT. 1. Section one of chapter three hundred forty-three of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, is amended by adding after the word “year,” in the fourth line thereof, the words ‘and also from the tributaries of said ponds for a term of three years, and thereafter

between the first day of November and the tenth day of June following, in each year,' so that said section as amended, will read as follows :

SECT. 1. All persons are prohibited hereby to take fish of any kind from the Spectacle ponds, so called, in the town of Porter, in the county of Oxford, between the first day of November and the tenth day of June following, in each year ; and also from the tributaries of said ponds for a term of three years, and thereafter between the first day of November and the tenth day of June following in each year.'

Taking of fish from Spectacle ponds between Nov. 1 and June 10, prohibited.

SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this act, shall, on conviction of the same before any trial justice in Oxford county, forfeit the sum of ten dollars, one half to the complainant and one half to the county of Oxford.

Penalty for violation.

Chapter 294.

An Act to authorize Charles G. Perry, Arthur C. Perry, and E. Sumner Perry to erect and maintain piers and booms in the Aroostook River.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Charles G. Perry, Arthur C. Perry and E. Sumner Perry, their associates, successors, heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to locate, build and maintain in that part of the Aroostook river, in the town of Caribou, in the county of Aroostook, that is described in section two of this act, all necessary piers and booms for the purpose of sorting and holding all logs and lumber driven down said river, or otherwise procured, which are destined or intended for use or manufacture at any mill, or mills, on said river, owned, controlled, managed or operated by said Perrys, their associates, successors, heirs and assigns.

Chas. G. Perry et als., authorized to build piers and booms in Caribou.

SECT. 2. Said piers and booms may be located, built and maintained in any part of said river which is within the bounds and limits named and described, and hereby established, as follows : commencing on the easterly bank of said river, at the north line of that part of lot numbered forty-five, now owned by said Perrys in that part of said Caribou formerly H township, thence west into said river a distance of one
