CAMP BENSON-PEOPLE'S PROHIBITORY LEAGUE.

Снар. 313 provided in chapter fifty-one of the revised statutes, and in addition to the preferred stock which said company is authorized and empowered to make and issue to Aroostook county, but the dividend to be paid on the preferred stock which may be issued to Aroostook county shall be paid, before any dividend is paid on the preferred stock authorized to be issued by this act.

SECT. 2. The holders of the preferred stock authorized to be issued by this act, shall not be entitled to vote upon said stock in stockholders' meeting.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 313.

An Act to legalize the proceedings by which Camp Benson Graud Army of the Republic Association was organized.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled. as follows:

The proceedings by which Camp Benson Grand Army of Doings and the Republic Association of Maine was organized, at Newport, on the twelfth of September, eighteen hundred and eightyseven are hereby confirmed and the organization is hereby declared legal and valid.

Chapter 314.

An Act to incorporate the People's Prohibitory Enforcement League of Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

John C. Stewart, Sidney T. Fuller and John W. Corporators. SECT. 1. Mitchell, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a corporation by the name of the People's Pro- -corporate hibitory Enforcement League of Maine, for the purpose of securing a thorough and effective enforcement of the prohibitory liquor law of the state of Maine, and efficiency in the law itself.
