COPYING PLANS-MADAWASKA THAINING SCHOOL-ADJ. GENERAL.

Chapter 98.

Resolve to provide for copying of old plans of Maine towns in archives of Massachusetts.

Plans of Maine, copying of, in favor of. Resolved, 'That the land agent be and is hereby directed to procure copies of old plans of Maine towns, now in the archives of the state of Massachusetts, such plans to be made in duplicate, one for the land office and one for the registry of deeds in the several counties where said towns lie, provided, that the expense shall not exceed the sum of twelve hundred dollars, which sum is hereby appropriated for that purpose.

Approved March 28, 1891.

Chapter 99.

Resolve in favor of Madawaska Training School.

Resolved, That the sum of five thousand dollars be appropriated from the state treasury for enlarging the school building of the Madawaska Training School at Fort Kent, and for the erection of a boarding house for the better accommodation of students attending said school, the same to be expended under the direction of the board of trustees of state normal schools.

Chapter 100.

Resolves concerning an amendment of the constitution, relative to appointment of Adjutant-General.

Constitution, amendment of. Resolved, That the following amendment to the constitution of this state be proposed for the action of the legal voters of this state in the manner provided by the constitution, namely : Section three, article seven of the constitution of this state is hereby amended, so that the same shall read as follows :

'Section 3. The major generals shall be elected by the senate and house of representatives each having a negative on the other. The adjutant general and quarter master general shall be appointed by the governor. But the adjutant general shall perform the duties of quarter master general until other wise directed by law.
