CHAP. 251

Chapter 251.

An Act to amend Section fourteen of Chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes, relating to Burying Grounds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sec. 14, ch. 15,
R. S., amended.

Act shall apply
to wills
probated since
Jan. 1, 1892.

SECT. 1. Section fourteen of chapter fifteen of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding to said section the following: 'Any city or town without giving bond therefor may be appointed by the probate court, testamentary trustee for the purpose of holding forever in accordance with the provisions of this section and the terms of the devise any fund devised for the purposes aforesaid.'

SECT. 2. The provisions of the foregoing amendment shall apply to wills which have been probated since January first, eighteen hundred ninety-two.

Chapter 252

An Act to prohibit the setting of Lobster Traps within certain limits.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Setting of lob-
ster traps within
300 feet of outer
end of any fish
weir, prohibited.

—penalty.

All persons are hereby prohibited from setting any lobster trap or traps within three hundred feet of the mouth or outer end of the leaders of any fish weir, under a penalty of five dollars for each offense, to be recovered on complaint before any court of competent jurisdiction in the county where the offense is committed, one half to the use of the complainant and one half to the use of said county.
