CHAP. 462**Chapter 462.**

An Act to amend the charter of the Waterville and Fairfield Railway and Light Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

W. & F. Rwy.
& Light Co.,
authorized to
extend road.

SECT. 1. The Waterville and Fairfield Railway and Light Company is hereby authorized to extend its railroad to, into and through the towns of Benton and Clinton with all the rights, powers and privileges and subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities by its charter granted and imposed.

Authoriz d to
supply towns
with light, etc.

SECT. 2. The said company is further authorized to supply the towns of Clinton and Benton with electricity for light, heat and power, and for that purpose may erect, establish and maintain all necessary posts, wires and appliances in the manner provided by general law.

Towns, author-
ized to contract
for light.

SECT. 3. The towns of Clinton and Benton, and any municipal corporation therein, are authorized to contract with said company for public lighting for a term of years and to renew the same.

SECT. 4. Section thirteen of chapter forty seven of the private and special laws for eighteen hundred and eighty seven is hereby repealed.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 463.

An Act to extend the time for the completion of the Skowhegan and Norridgewock Railroad.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

N. R. R.,
extended.

The time for the completion of the Skowhegan and Norridgewock Railroad, as specified in section ten, chapter five hundred and fifty-one, of the private and special laws for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, is hereby extended two years from the date therein named.
