Chapter 609.

An Act to regulate the taking of fish from Johnson Brook, so called, in the towns of Burnham, in the County of Waldo, Pittsfield in the County of Somerset and Clinton in the County of Kennebec.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from taking or catching any fish from the waters of Johnson brook, so called, situated in the towns of Burnham, in the county of Waldo, Pittsfield in the county of Somerset, and Clinton in the county of Kennebec, between the twentieth day of June and the first day of April following of any year or years.

Taking of fish from Johnson brook, between June 20 and April 1, prohibited.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act, shall be punished by a fine of five dollars, and an additional fine of one dollar for each fish so taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice or other court in said counties of Waldo, Somerset or Kennebec, one-half to the use of the complainant and the other half to the use of the county wherein the offense was committed.

Penalty.

Chapter 610.

An Act to protect Trout in Marshall Pond and its tributaries, in the towns of Hebron, Oxford and Paris in Oxford County, for a period of three years.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. No person shall take, catch, kill, fish for or destroy any trout in Marshall pond or its tributaries, in the towns of Hebron, Oxford and Paris in the county of Oxford, during the period of three years from the time this act takes effect.

Taking of trout from Marshall pond for three years, prohibited.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act, shall forfeit and pay the sum of ten dollars for the offense, and one dollar for each and every such trout so taken, caught, killed or destroyed, to be recovered by complaint before any municipal court or trial justice in said county, one-half to the complainant and one-half to the county.

Penalty.
