CHAP. 611

Chapter 611.

An Act for the protection of fish in Hobbs Pond and its tributaries, in the town of Hope, in the County of Knox.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Taking of fish from Hobbs pond between October 1 and July 1, prohibited.

SECT. 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from fishing or taking fish of any kind in any manner from the Hobbs pond or any of its tributaries, in the town of Hope, in the county of Knox, between the first day of October and the first day of July following, of each year for the period of four years.

Penalty.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act, shall be liable to a penalty of ten dollars for the offense, and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish taken in violation hereof, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice or municipal or police court, in said county of Knox, one-half to complainant and one-half to said county of Knox.

Approved March 23, 1893.

Chapter 612.

An Act for the protection of trout in Eagle Lake, in the town of Eden, in the county of Hancock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Taking of trout from Eagle lake, from October 1 to May 1, for four years, prohibited.

SECT. 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from fishing for or taking any trout from Eagle lake, in the town of Eden, in the county of Hancock, from the first day of October in each year to the first day of May following for a period of four years.

Penalty.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine of five dollars for the offense, and a further penalty of one dollar for each trout so taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice in said county, one-half to the complainant and one-half to the said county of Hancock.
