Chapter 234.

An Act to incorporate the Carrabasset Water Power Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Mark Emery, Ben S. Collins, Wallace Emery and Gould A. Porter, their associates and assigns, are hereby incorporated under the name of the Carrabasset Water Power Company, with all the powers and privileges of similar corporations.

Corporators.

Corporate name.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is hereby empowered and authorized to build a dam at the outlets of Middle Carrying Place pond and Rowe pond, both of said ponds being in Somerset county, and to flow said ponds and to deepen and widen the channels at the outlets of said ponds, thereby enabling them to store water in Sandy stream and Carrabasset river, in times of drought either in summer or winter, and they also use said water to facilitate the driving of logs and lumber down Sandy stream and Carrabasset river.

Authorized to build dam, etc.

SECT. 3. Said company may take all necessary land and materials for building said dam and widening and deepening the outlets of said ponds and may flow contiguous lands so far as necessary to raise suitable heads of water; and if the parties cannot agree on the damages the corporation shall pay the proprietors for land and material so taken, such damages as shall be ascertained and determined by the county commissioners of Somerset county in the same manner and under the same conditions and limitations as provided by law in case of damage by laying out of highways; and for damages occasioned by flowing land, said company shall not be liable to an action at common law, but the proceedings shall be had as when a complaint is made under the statutes of this state for flowing lands occasioned by raising a head of water for the working of mills.

May take land and materials.

Damages, and how determined.

SECT. 4. Said company may issue its capital stock to an amount not exceeding five thousand dollars, to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each.

Capital stock.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
