Chapter 299.

An Act to amend the charter of the Bar Harbor Water Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Powers.

SECT. 1. In addition to the powers conferred upon it by its act of incorporation and by acts amendatory thereof and additional thereto, the Bar Harbor Water Company for the purposes of its incorporation shall have the following powers.

May purchase stock of Eden Water Co. SECT. 2. To purchase and hold the stock of the Eden Water Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the state of Maine, being same corporation named in special act of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, chapter five hundred and forty-eight.

May take water from Turtle Lake. SECT. 3. To take, detain and use, but not exclusively, the water of Turtle lake and of the stream flowing thence to Eagle lake, and of any stream tributary to either of said lakes.

May erect

SECT. 4. To erect a dam or dams for the purpose of raising the level and increasing the capacity of either or both of said lakes, or of any such stream. Damages caused by flowage shall be assessed and paid in the manner provided by the Bar Harbor Water Company's charter in case of taking land for any of its corporate purposes.

Damages, how paid.

SECT. 5. To supply water to the inhabitants of any part of the town of Eden not only for domestic purposes, but also for shipping and the extinguishment of fires.
