But nothing in this act shall be construed to give the recorder CHAP. 315
 authority to act other than in criminal cases. Said recorder —fees.
 shall receive as compensation for his services the same fees
 allowed by law to trial justices, in criminal cases, except that
 he shall receive for the trial of an issue one dollar for each
 day employed, together with ten cents per mile travel to and
 from the place where said trial shall be held.'

SECT. 2. Section twenty of said act is hereby amended, so Sec. 20,
amended.
 as to read as follows :

'SECT. 20. From and after April first, eighteen hundred Salary of
judge.
 and ninety-five the judge of said court shall receive as com-
 pensation an annual salary of five hundred dollars, to be paid
 quarterly from the treasury of the county of Hancock
 together with actual expenses incurred by him in the trial of
 criminal cases in any town other than that in which said judge
 may reside ; and in addition thereto said judge shall receive —fees.
 for every blank writ signed by him, five cents ; for entry of
 each civil action, sixty cents. The judge shall receive for
 every warrant issued by him, one dollar, which together with
 all costs and fines received by him in criminal cases shall,
 within sixty days after receipt thereof be by him paid into
 the treasury of the county of Hancock.'

Chapter 315.

An Act to provide in part for the Expenditures of Government.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
 in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. In order to provide for the several acts and Act of appro-
priation, for
1895.
 resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money
 from the treasury, and also provide for the necessary expen-
 ditures of government for the current fiscal year of eighteen
 hundred and ninety-five, the following sums are hereby
 appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the
 governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is
 authorized, at any time prior to the first day of January next,
 to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the same :

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Act of appropriation, for 1896.

SECT. 1. In order to provide for the several acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is authorized, at any time between the first day of January, eighteen hundred and ninety-six, and the first day of January, eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, to draw his warrant on the treasury for the same.
