Chapter 26.

Resolve to repair state bridge near Seven Islands, Upper Saint John.

Bridge, over
Depo stream,
in favor of.

Resolved, That there is appropriated out of any money in the treasury of state, the sum of five hundred dollars for the repairs of the state bridge over Depo stream on the road leading from Seven Islands on the Upper Saint John river to Saint Popham, Province of Quebec, Canada.

To be appropriated for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five and expended by an agent appointed by the governor, and when said bridge is completed, he shall draw his warrant on the treasury for the same.

Approved February 21, 1895.

Chapter 27.

Resolve to rebuild the state bridge over Fish River on the road leading from Ashland to Fort Kent.

Bridge, over
Fish river, in
favor of.

Resolved, That there is hereby appropriated eight hundred dollars out of any money in the treasury of the state to assist in rebuilding the bridge over Fish River between Eagle and Long lake, known as the Nedeau bridge, said money to be expended by the county commissioners of Aroostook county and paid by the state when said commissioners have rebuilt said bridge. Said bridge to be at least four feet higher than the old one.

Chapter 28.

Resolve in favor of the town of Milo.

Town of Milo,
in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid by the treasurer of state out of the school funds of the current year, to the town of Milo, the sum of two hundred twenty-five dollars and four cents, it being a balance equitably due said town as its proportion of the school funds for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three.
