CHAP. 74**Chapter 74.**

Resolves authorizing a temporary loan for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-five.

Temporary
loan,
authorized.

Resolved, That to provide for the wants of the treasury, the treasurer of state be, and is hereby authorized to procure on the faith of the state, if he shall deem it necessary, at any time during the year eighteen hundred and ninety-five, a temporary loan of three hundred thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be needed.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state be, and hereby is authorized to give notes in behalf of the state, payable within two years from the date hereof, for such portions of the loan hereby authorized, as may be required.

Chapter 75.

Resolve in aid of completing a road in Jerusalem Plantation in Franklin County.

Road in Jeru-
salem Pl., in
favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred fifty dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-five to be expended under the direction of the county commissioners of Franklin county towards the completion of the road from Drew's Mills in Jerusalem plantation in Franklin county, to the main road in Dead River plantation in Somerset county.

Chapter 76.

Resolve relating to certain school lots in Merrill Plantation.

School lots in
Merrill Pl.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of one hundred dollars to be used by the land agent in setting off and locating certain school lots in Merrill plantation, said sum to be paid back to the state out of the first money collected for stumpage from the lots so set off.
