Chapter 376.

An Act to authorize the Dexter and Newport Railroad Company to issue bonds and to make a mortgage securing the same, and to authorize the Maine Central Railroad Company to guarantee the payment of said bonds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. I. The president and directors of the Dexter and Newport Railroad Company are hereby authorized and empowered, for the purpose of carrying into effect a contract or lease between said company and the Maine Central Railroad Company, authorized by act of legislature approved February nineteen, eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, to issue its bonds to the amount of one hundred and seventy-five thousand dollars, of such denomination and upon such time of payment, and at such rate of interest as they may deem for the interest of said company, and to secure the payment of said bonds, both principal and interest, by a mortgage of all the property of said company which they now have or may subsequently acquire, and also the franchise of said company, without prior incumbrance.

Dexter and Newport Railroad Company, authorized to issue bonds to carry out contract.

Sect. 2. The Maine Central Railroad Company, for the purposes aforesaid, is hereby authorized and empowered to guarantee the payment of said bonds, both principal and interest.

Maine Central may guarantee bonds.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 377.

An Act to repeal so much of Chapter four hundred and sixty-one of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five, entitled "An Act granting additional powers to the inhabitants of school district number five, in the town of Kennebunk," and acts additional thereto and amendatory thereof, as relates to the maintenance of schools and school houses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. I. Section one of chapter four hundred and sixty-one of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five is hereby amended by striking out so much thereof as relates to the maintenance of schools and school buildings in said district, so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

Section 1, chapter 461, private laws, 1885, amended.
