CHAP. 205 in rank and grade of teaching with a first class academy, of not less than three terms of ten weeks each during each year; and provided further, that the governor and council and superintendent of common schools shall have a right at all times to visit said school when the same shall be in operation; and if in the opinion of the governor and council said institution shall at any time hereafter fail to fulfill the condition of this resolve, they may in their discretion, withhold the appropriation herein granted.

Chapter 205.

Resolve in favor of the Town of Brunswick.

Town of

Resolved, That the state treasurer be and is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the town of Brunswick, one thousand nine hundred eighty-one dollars and fifty-eight cents, it being to refund to said town the amount paid by it for the support of state paupers at the insane hospital, the same to be paid when said claim shall be allowed by the governor and council.

Chapter 206.

Resolve in favor of the City of Calais.

City of Calais, in
favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of eleven hundred and eighty-five dollars and twenty-five cents be and is hereby appropriated for the purpose of paying to the city of Calais, the amount due to it from railroad taxes in the years eighteen hundred and ninety-four, eighteen hundred and ninety-five and eighteen hundred and ninety-six on the stock owned by Mrs. Mary H. Pike of Calais, whose residence was erroneously recorded.
