CHAP. 361**Chapter 361.**

An Act to regulate fishing in the Fenderson Brook, and all its tributaries, in the Town of Parsonsfield.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Close time for fishing in Fenderson brook.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for a term of four years to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time, in the Fenderson brook, so called, or in any of its tributaries all in the town of Parsonsfield.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be liable to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing.

Approved March 21, 1907.

Chapter 362.

An Act to regulate fishing in Pocasset Lake and Pickerel Pond, in the Town of Wayne, in the County of Kennebec.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Ice fishing in Pocasset lake and Pickerel pond prohibited.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish through the ice in Pocasset lake or in Pickerel pond, in the town of Wayne, county of Kennebec.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing.

Approved March 21, 1907.

Chapter 363.

An Act to prohibit the throwing of sawdust and other refuse into Olamon Stream, so called, in the County of Penobscot.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Throwing of sawdust into Olamon stream prohibited.

Section 1. No person shall cast or throw in Olamon stream, so called, in the county of Penobscot, any sawdust, shavings, bark or other mill waste or refuse of any kind along the banks of said waters in such manner that the same shall fall or be washed into said stream.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than five nor more than fifty dollars and costs for each offense.

Approved March 21, 1907.
