Section 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, municipal and police courts and trial justices within their respective counties shall have original and concurrent jurisdiction with supreme and superior courts.

Court jurisdiction.

Approved March 3, 1909.

Chapter 78.

An Act to extend the charter of the Gardiner Trust Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The rights, powers and privileges of the Gardiner Trust Company, located at Gardiner, Kennebec county, Maine, which were granted by chapter fifty-nine of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five, approved February seventeen, nineteen hundred and five, are hereby extended for one year, from the approval of this act, and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted by said original act, to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as specified therein; provided, however, that said company shall actually commence business as a trust company within said one year.

Charter extended.

Approved March 3, 1909.

Chapter 79.

An Act to enlarge the rights of the Alfred Embroidery Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The Alfred Embroidery Company, a corporation existing under the general laws of the state of Maine, is hereby authorized and empowered to carry on the following business in addition to those named in its certificate of organization.

Corporate rights enlarged.

Section 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to make, generate, sell, distribute and supply gas and electricity for lighting, heating, manufacturing and mechanical purposes in the town of Alfred with all the rights and powers and subject to all the duties and liabilities of similar corporations organized under the general law of the state.

May generate and sell gas and electricity.
