Chapter 119.

An Act to ratify, confirm and make valid the consolidation of certain railroads under the name of Sandy River and Rangeley Lakes Railroad, and enlarge the powers of said railroad.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Organiza-
tion made
valid.

Section 1. The organization and incorporation of the Sandy River and Rangeley Lakes Railroad is hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid.

Acts of con-
solidation
made valid.

Section 2. All the acts and doings of the Sandy River and Rangeley Lakes Railroad, in the consolidation of the Sandy River Railroad Company, the Franklin and Megantic Railway Company and the Kingfield and Dead River Railway Company and the subsequent acquisition of the Phillips and Rangeley Railroad Company and the Madrid Railroad Company, are hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid.

Mortgage
made valid.

Section 3. The mortgage of said Sandy River and Rangeley Lakes Railroad issued to the Maine Trust and Banking Company, trustee, dated February one, nineteen hundred eight is hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid.

May engage
in express
business.

Section 4. The Sandy River and Rangeley Lakes Railroad is hereby authorized to do an express business over the lines of railroad which are now or may be hereafter owned, leased or controlled by it.

Chapter 120.

An Act relating to an open season for the hunting of certain game birds in the County of Hancock.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1,
chapter 281,
special
laws, 1907,
amended.

Section one of chapter two hundred and eighty-one of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven is hereby amended by striking out the word "September" in the third line thereof and inserting the word 'November' in its place, and by striking out the word "February" in the third line thereof and inserting the word 'April' in its place so that said section one, as amended, will read as follows:

son for
hunting.

'Section 1. It shall be lawful to hunt, chase, catch and kill the game bird known as golden eye or whistler in the county of Hancock from November first to the first day of April of the following year.'
