### Chapter 136.

An Act to amend the law relating to Political Caucuses in the City of Bangor.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section two of chapter four hundred and seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven is hereby amended by adding after words at the end of said section the following: 'at the August session of each year as herein provided,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 2. After the board of registration shall have made the list of voters for the year nineteen hundred and seven with the party designation as provided in section three of said act, such party designation shall remain the same on that list and the lists for subsequent years unless a voter in person or in writing signed by him, shall request his party designation to be changed at the August session of each year as herein provided.'

### Chapter 137.

An Act to protect White perch in Ellis pond, sometimes called Roxbury pond, in the towns of Roxbury and Byron in the county of Oxford.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. During the open season on white perch provided in the general law of the state, it shall be unlawful for any one person in any one day to take, catch or kill or have in possession more than twenty white perch taken, caught or killed in Ellis pond, sometimes called Roxbury pond, in the towns of Roxbury and Byron, in the county of Oxford, under the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing or catching of perch.

Section 2. Municipal and police courts and trial justices in their respective counties shall have original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts in all offenses arising under this act.
