Chapter 157.

An Act to amend Section three of Chapter four hundred and seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three, relating to fishing in Rangeley Stream, so called.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section 1. So much of section three of chapter four hundred and seven of private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three as prohibits fishing in Rangeley stream, so called, Franklin county, from the sign at the old wharf near the head of said stream down to the dam across said stream, in accordance with the general law of the state is hereby repealed. Provided, however, that during open season on that part of stream above named it shall be unlawful to fish except in the ordinary way of casting with artificial flies or fly fishing, and no person shall take and kill more than one fish in any day in said waters.

Fishing in part of Rangeley stream, permitted.

—proviso.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for the illegal fishing for and catching trout and land-locked salmon.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Section 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and police courts and trial justices within their respective counties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees for the protection of birds and game.

Court jurisdiction.

Chapter 158.

An Act to amend section two of chapter four hundred and seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three, relating to fishing in Roach River, in Piscataquis County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

So much of section two of chapter four hundred and seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three as prohibits fishing in Roach river, so called, during June, July and August of each year, in the ordinary way of casting with artificial flies, or fly fishing, from the dam across Roach river down to and including the mouth of its tributary, Lazy Tom, so called, a distance of one and one-half miles, is hereby repealed.

Fishing in part of Roach river, permitted.
