Chapter 350.

An Act to amend Chapter one hundred and ninety-eight of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, relating to records of Real Estate in the County of Waldo.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section two of chapter one hundred and ninety-eight of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven is hereby amended by striking out all after the word "index" in the sixth line thereof, and inserting in lieu thereof the following, 'which shall show in addition to the names of the parties and the nature of the instrument, the year of the instrument and the year of its record and the name of the town, city or unincorporated place where the land conveyed is situated,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 2. The copies shall be made on paper of the kind and quality used for recording deeds in the registry of deeds for said county of Waldo, and shall be bound into books corresponding in size and quality now in use in said office, and shall be indexed in the form known as ledger index, which shall show in addition to the names of the parties and the nature of the instrument, the year of the instrument and the year of its record and the name of the town, city or unincorporated place where the land is situated.'

Chapter 351.

An Act to amend Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and one, Chapter four hundred and one, Section two, relating to the taking of Smelts in Pleasant River, in Washington County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section two of chapter four hundred and one of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one is hereby amended by striking out the word "twentieth" in the second line of said section and substituting therefor the word 'first' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

amended.

'Section 2. No smelts shall be taken or fished for except by hook and line between the first day of May and the first day of October.'
