#### CHAP. 361

Penalty.

Section 2. Any person who violates any provision of this act shall be punished by a fine of not less than three hundred dollars nor more than five hundred dollars for each offense.

Approved April 1, 1909.

### Chapter 361.

An Act to amend Section one of Chapter one hundred sixty-nine of the Special Laws of nineteen hundred and three relating to the Young Women's Christian Association of Portland, Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1, Chapter 169, special laws, 1903, amended. Section I. Section one of chapter one hundred sixty-nine of the special laws of nineteen hundred and three is hereby amended by substituting for the word "fifty" in the sixth line of said section the words 'one hundred', so that said act as amended shall read as follows:

May hold by deed, bequest or otherwise, property to the amount of \$100,000. 'Section I. The Young Women's Christian Association of the city of Portland, Maine, a corporation organized under the laws of this state and located at said Portland in said county of Cumberland is hereby authorized and empowered to hold by deed, devise, bequest or otherwise, property, personal and real to the amount of one hundred thousand dollars.

Certain acts and doings, made valid. Section 2. The acts and doings of the meeting of said corporation held on the twelfth day of May, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and two, are hereby ratified, confirmed and declared to be legal and valid.

#### Chapter 362.

An Act to amend the Charter of the City of Augusta with reference to Augusta Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 11, of charter of the city of Augusta, amended. Section I. Section eleven of the charter of the city of Augusta, which was numbered as section thirteen in chapter three hundred and seventy-three of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Municipal court.

'Section II. There shall be and hereby is established a court, to be denominated the municipal court of the city of Augusta, which shall be a court of record, with a seal, to consist of one judge, who shall have concurrent jurisdiction with justices of the peace in all matters, civil and criminal, within the county

-jurisdiction of court.
