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quire. The temporary clerk shall record the proceedings, until and including the qualifications of the secretary of the corporation by his being sworn. No organization shall be affected at any such meeting or its adjournment unless a majority of the incorporators are present in person or by proxy. The original incorporators shall elect a board of directors, who shall thereafter choose one of their number a president, also an executive committee, a secretary and other officers, which under the by-laws they are authorized to choose. The president, the secretary and a majority of the directors, shall forthwith make, sign and swear to the certificate, setting forth the date of the approval of this charter, the name and purposes of the corporation, the amount of capital stock, the amount already paid in, the par value of the shares, the name and residence of the owners, the name of the county where it is located, and the number and names of the incorporators acting as directors. Such certificate shall be recorded in the registry of deeds in the county where the principal office is to be located, and a copy thereof certified by such register shall be filed in the secretary of state's office who shall enter the date of filing thereof, and on the original certificate to be kept by the corporation, and shall record said copy in a book kept for that purpose. And from the time of filing said certificate in the secretary of state's office the stockholders of said corporation, their successors and assigns, shall be a corporation with the powers hereinbefore granted.

—clerk shall record proceedings.

—majority of incorporators must be present.

—shall elect board of directors, who shall choose a president, executive committee, secretary, etc.

—certificate prepared by officers and recorded in registry of deeds and secretary of state's office.

### Chapter 408.

An Act in relation to the Limington Public Cemetery Corporation.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

The Limington Public Cemetery Corporation is hereby allowed and granted the authority to enlarge their burying ground, known as the Limington Public Cemetery, to wit; beginning at the west side of the gate in front of the O. P. Allen house, so called, and running from said house or gate westerly on the south side of the road about twelve rods to a point that would meet at right angles, the west end line as the fence now is, giving them the right to fence and use all the land south of this line.

Authorized to enlarge burying ground.
