**Chapter 5.**

Resolve in favor of the Hayes' Young Women's Home at Lewiston.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of one thousand dollars to be paid to the Women's Christian Association of Lewiston for the benefit of the Hayes' Young Women's Home at Lewiston, for the use of said institution for the year one thousand nine hundred and nine and one thousand dollars for the use of said institution for the year one thousand nine hundred and ten.

**Chapter 6.**

Resolve in aid of the Temporary Home for Women and Children at Portland.

Resolved, that the sum of seven thousand dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the use of the Temporary Home for Women and Children at Portland, of which three thousand five hundred dollars shall be paid to said institution during the year nineteen hundred and nine, and three thousand five hundred dollars during the year nineteen hundred and ten.
