Resolve in favor of Lewis Barrows.

Resolved, that the sum of twenty-five dollars be paid to Lewis Barrows for his services as page in the senate at the opening and inauguration ceremonies of the seventy-fourth legislature.

Resolved, that the sum of sixty dollars and thirty-four cents be paid W. A. Walker, chairman of joint committee on state prison, to defray expenses incurred by him on account of visit of said committee to the Maine state prison at Thomaston, also for expense incurred in visiting the University of Maine as a member of the committee on education.
