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**Chapter 160.**

Resolve in favor of the Lee Normal Academy.

Resolved, that the sum of one thousand dollars is hereby annually appropriated, for the term of two years, out of the school fund, to Lee Normal Academy, an institution of learning located in the town of Lee, in the county of Penobscot; provided, however, that this appropriation is made on the express conditions that the trustees of said institution shall maintain and keep in operation a school equal in rank and grade of teaching with a first-class academy, and in which shall be given special and systematic instruction in the science and art of teaching; that no part of this appropriation shall be devoted to other purposes than the payment of instructors in said institution; that the superintendent of public schools shall be, ex-officio, a member of the board of directors thereof, and that if in the opinion of the governor and council, said institution at any time hereafter shall fail to fulfill the conditions contained in this resolve, they may, in their discretion, withhold the appropriation herein granted; and the further sum of fifteen hundred dollars is hereby appropriated to said academy to be expended by the trustees thereof for the payment of the debt incurred by the erection of the dormitory connected with said institution; and further provided, that said normal academy shall not be entitled to any aid from the state for the years nineteen hundred nine and nineteen hundred ten in addition to that carried by this resolve.

**Chapter 161.**
