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CHAP. 162**Chapter 162.**

Resolve in favor of a monument marker on the Battle Ground of Cedar Mountain, Virginia.

Resolved, that the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars be, and is hereby appropriated to be expended during the year one thousand nine hundred and nine for the purpose of erecting a monument at the battle ground of the battle of Cedar mountain, Virginia, which occurred August ninth, eighteen hundred and sixty two, and in which the Tenth Maine regiment participated with bravery, to perpetuate the bravery of our patriotic Maine soldiers in said regiment who were killed and wounded in that battle. Said monument to mark the spot where the colors of said regiment were during the battle. And said spot to be located by the duly authorized committee of the First, Tenth and Twenty-ninth Regimental Association. Said monument to be constructed, conveyed and erected by said committee. Maine granite to be preferred for the monument, if feasible. Said sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to be paid said committee for said association when the governor and council of Maine shall be officially satisfied that said suitable monument has been thus erected, that all lawful bills and expenses incurred therein have been paid, and when the same shall have been voted satisfactory by said association.

**Chapter 163.**

Resolve to provide for repairs of road leading from Roach River to the Grant Farm.

Resolved, that there be, and hereby is appropriated the sum of seven hundred fifty dollars to aid in the repair of the road leading from Roach river to the Grant farm, so called, near the outlet of Ragged lake. The same to be expended upon that portion of the road between the southerly line of township number one, range thirteen, Piscataquis county, and the Grant farm, under the direction of an agent to be appointed for that purpose by the governor and council.
