CHAP. 220**Chapter 220.**

Resolve in favor of screening Worthley Pond, so called, in the town of Peru, in the County of Oxford.

Worthley Pond, to provide for screening of.

Resolved, that the sum of twenty-five dollars be and is hereby appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and ten, to be paid out of the general appropriation for the operation of the fish hatcheries and feeding stations for fish and for the protection of fish, for the purpose of screening Worthley pond, so called, in the town of Peru, in the county of Oxford, to be expended under the direction of the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, when the balance necessary to erect said screen, as found by the commissioners, shall have been raised by the citizens of Oxford county, and paid into the treasurer of state for this purpose.

Proviso.

Provided, further, that this appropriation shall not be available until the town of Peru shall have, in legal town meeting, and having an article in the warrant for said town meeting for that purpose, by vote of record, voted to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of the water through the same.

Chapter 221.

Resolve in favor of screening Toddy Pond, in the town of Orland, in Hancock County.

Toddy Pond, to provide for screening of.

Resolved, that the sum of three hundred dollars be and is hereby appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and ten, to be paid out of the general appropriation for the operation of the fish hatcheries and feeding stations for fish and for the protection of fish, for the purpose of screening Toddy pond, so called, in the town of Orland, in Hancock county, to be expended under the direction of the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, when the balance necessary to erect said screen, as found by the commissioners, shall have been raised by the citizens of Hancock county, and paid into the treasurer of state for this purpose.

Proviso.

Provided, further, that this appropriation shall not be available until the town of Orland shall have, in legal town meeting, and having an article in the warrant for said town meeting for that purpose, by vote of record, voted to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of the water through the same.
