Chapter 251.

Resolve in favor of the Secretary of State.

Resolved, that the treasurer of state pay to the secretary of state the sum of four hundred and ten dollars for the purpose of furnishing to the several clerks of committees postage stamps for use of said committees.

Chapter 252.

Resolve for the maintenance of State Bridges located in the city of Old Town and the town of Milford.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of twelve hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred and nine, and the sum of twelve hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred and ten, for the maintenance of the bridges which reverted to the state under chapter four hundred and two of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven.

Resolve authorizing the Land Agent to release the interest of the State in the Islet called Turnip Island in Bristol, in Lincoln County.

Resolved, that the state land agent be and he is hereby authorized and empowered upon payment of a nominal consideration to make, execute and deliver a good and sufficient deed releasing to Albert Thorpe, of Bristol, Lincoln county, Maine, and his heirs and assigns all the right, title and interest which
