**Chapter 271.**

Resolve in favor of Parker Pineo.

Resolved, that the sum of eighty dollars be and hereby is appropriated, for fourteen sheep killed by dogs or wild animals in the year of nineteen hundred and four, and six sheep killed by dogs or wild animals in the year nineteen hundred and five; said appropriation to be paid to Parker Pineo of Topsfield, by the state treasurer, from the dog license tax.

**Chapter 272.**

Resolve in favor of screening Biscay Pond, so called, in the town of Bristol, in Lincoln County.

Resolved, that the sum of two hundred dollars be and is hereby appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and ten, to be paid out of the general appropriation for the operation of the fish hatcheries and feeding stations for fish and for the protection of fish, for the purpose of screening Biscay pond, so called, in the town of Bristol, in Lincoln county, to be expended under the direction of the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, when the balance necessary to erect said screen, as found by the commissioners, shall have been raised by the citizens of Lincoln county, and paid into the treasurer of state for this purpose.

Provided, further, that this appropriation shall not be available until the town of Bristol shall have, in legal town meeting, and having an article in the warrant for said town meeting for that purpose, by vote of record, voted to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of the water through the same.
