Resolve in favor of the Clerk and Stenographer to the Committee on Railroads and Expresses.

Resolved, that there be and is hereby appropriated to be paid to G. F. Giddings, the sum of two hundred dollars, for services as clerk and stenographer to the committee on railroads and expresses.

Resolved, that the sum of twenty-five dollars be paid to each of the regular state house employees who have served under the superintendent of public buildings more than one year, for extra services rendered during the session of the legislature, thirteen in number, amounting to three hundred and twenty-five dollars.
