Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of twenty-six thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and nine, for the support of patients, said sum to be expended under the direction of the trustees of insane hospitals.

Resolved, that there be appropriated and paid to Verdi Ludgate, chairman of the committee on education, the sum of ninety dollars and fifty cents for expenses incurred by said committee in visiting schools at Gorham, Farmington, Machias, Dexter, Orono, Lewiston, Wilton and Mars Hill.

Resolve in favor of Clerk of the Committee on Interior Waters.
