Chapter 321.

Resolve in favor of James A. Chase, Mail Carrier of the House.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated to be paid James A. Chase, the sum of fifty dollars for expenses incurred as mail carrier of the house.

Chapter 322.

Resolve in favor of Ray P. Eaton.

Resolved, that the sum of nine hundred and eighty-nine dollars and twelve cents be paid to Ray P. Eaton being the amount paid by him for clerk hire in excess of the allowance provided by law as register of deeds of Cumberland county from the first day of July, nineteen hundred and five, to the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and six.

Chapter 323.

Resolve in favor of the clerk and stenographer of the Committee on Mercantile Affairs and Insurance and of the Committee on Telegraphs and Telephones.

Resolved, that the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars be and hereby is appropriated to be paid to Thomas W. Williams for services as clerk and stenographer to the committee on mercantile affairs and insurance and the committee on telegraphs and telephones.

Chapter 324.

Resolve in favor of the clerk to the Committee on Education.

Resolved, that there be appropriated and paid to James G. Scales the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars for services as clerk and typewriter to the committee on education.
