Chapter 334.

Resolve in favor of clerk to the Committee on Claims.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated to be paid Eugene Taylor, the sum of one hundred and seventy-five dollars, for services as clerk to the committee on claims.

Chapter 335.

Resolve in favor of John Good of Benedicta, Maine.

Whereas on the third day of December, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and eight, the commissioners of inland fisheries and game allowed and certified to the state auditor a bill in the sum of three dollars, in favor of John Good, of Benedicta, Maine, for damage done to his growing crops by deer, by virtue of the provisions of the statute in such cases made and provided.

Preamble.

And whereas there was at that time in the state treasury a sufficient sum available in fines and license fees to pay this bill.

John Good, in favor of.

And whereas by reason of this bill not being audited and allowed by the state auditor before December thirty-first last, on which date all unexpended license fees and fines lapsed and are not now available to pay this claim.

Therefore, be it resolved, that the sum of three dollars be and is hereby appropriated to be paid to said John Good of Benedicta, Maine, to satisfy said claim.

Chapter 336.

Resolve in favor of the clerk and stenographer to the committees on Insane Hospitals and School for Feeble Minded.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated to be paid to Chapin Lydston the sum of two hundred dollars for services as clerk and stenographer to the committees on insane hospitals and school for feeble minded.
