Chapter 16.

CHAP. 16

AN Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in Fresh Pond, in the Town of North Haven, in the County of Knox.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

For a period of five years from the time this act takes effect, no person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Fresh pond, so-called, in the town of North Haven, in the county of Knox. During the same period no person shall have in possession at any time any kind of fish taken in violation of any provision of this act. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense, and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.

Chapter 17.

AN Act Additional to Chapter Forty-eight of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Borrowing of Money and Pledging of Securities as Collateral Therefor by Savings Banks and Institutions for Savings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Savings banks and institutions for savings may, by vote of the trustees of such corporation, when in the judgment of said trustees such action is necessary to pay depositors and to prevent loss by sales of assets, borrow money within or without the State and may pledge bonds, notes or other securities as collateral therefor.

Section 2. The trustees of such corporation shall cause a copy of said vote to be sent forthwith to the Bank Commissioner, and shall also notify him of any action taken thereunder.

Chapter 18.

AN Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in North Branch Brook and Its Tributaries, in the County of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in North Branch brook, so-called, in the county
