CHAP. 51

Chapter 51.

An Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to the Protection of Foxes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Closed time
on foxes.

Section 1. No person shall at any time between the first day of March and the first day of November following of each year dig out, molest or destroy in any way any fox den or fox dens, or remove or cause to be removed therefrom any fox or foxes, except those enclosed in private fox ranches.

—penalty.

Section 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine of ten dollars and costs for each offense.

Approved March 10, 1915.

Chapter 52.

An Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in Meadow Brook and Its Tributaries, in the Towns of Stockton Springs and Prospect, in the County of Waldo.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Closed time
on fish in
Meadow
brook.

Section 1. No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Meadow brook, so-called, in the towns of Stockton Springs and Prospect, in the county of Waldo, or in any of its tributaries; nor shall any person have in possession at any time any kind of fish taken in any of said waters.

—penalty.

Section 2. Whoever violates any provision of section one of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of said section.
