—attendance. Statutes said town shall be reimbursed by the State a sum equal to two-thirds the amount paid for instruction in such evening school provided there shall have been offered, in addition to the subjects elsewhere prescribed for evening schools, courses in the commercial branches, the domestic and manual arts or the elements of the trades, said courses to be subject to the approval of the State Superintendent of Public Schools, and no town shall be entitled to receive a reimbursement under the provisions of this section unless the total average attendance in said courses shall equal to not less than twenty-five per cent of the average attendance of the school.'

Chapter 91.

An Act to Amend Section One Hundred Ten of Chapter Fifteen of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Course of Study in the State Normal Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one hundred ten of chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words "subject to the approval of the Governor and Council" in the third line thereof and by inserting after the word "same" in the fifth line thereof the words 'and they may give such credit as they may deem advisable for successful teaching experience,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 110. The course of study shall occupy two years with suitable vacations; and with the terms of admission shall be arranged by said superintendent. The trustees may arrange for a course of study, occupying three or four years, for such students as elect to pursue the same, and they may give such credit as they may deem advisable for successful teaching experience.'

Chapter 92.

An Act to Amend Section One of Chapter Two of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Eleven, Providing for a Close Time on Scallops.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter two of the Public Laws of nineteen Ch. 2, Sec. 1, hundred eleven is hereby amended by adding at the end of said section the following:

Trustees may regulate courses and give credit.
